



Busy in English

Wow.... Term 3 is just about over and I cannot believe how fast this year is passing us by.

It has been busy in the English classroom as assessments were completed and new units started. The 7/8's have been busy working with the novel *Black Snake: the Daring of Ned Kelly.* Using evidence from the biography, students created persuasive texts to argue if Ned Kelly was a hero, victim or villain. There were some interesting standpoints! They continue using the novel as they craft imaginative recounts for their next assessment, pretending they are a character who witnessed an event in Ned's life.

The 9/10's read the novel *Tom Appleby, Convict Boy* and for assessment, added a scene which could be used as a screenplay, in exam conditions. There were some very creative perspectives and it was enjoyable to read what the students created. Moving into their new unit, the class will read *12 Angry Men*, a play which deals with the themes of prejudice and equality. Students will create a script as if they are a journalist interviewing one of the characters after the events of the play.

In year 11, Eligh has finished the novel *48 Shades of Brown* which deals with themes around becoming an adult. For assessment, Eligh created a short story to fill a gap in the novel. We are now moving into the final unit of year 11 where we look at the movie *Lion* with themes of belonging and cultural heritage.


Lastly, our year 12 student, Breanna, created a short story using poems from Indigenous authors as inspiration. Excitingly, Breanna is in her last unit of English study, where she reads the novel *1984*. This novel discusses themes of freedom, political agenda and control of information. For her final English assessment, Breanna will complete an external exam where she analyses a topic in the novel.

It has been a pleasure working with our secondary students through Term 3 and I am already excited for what Term 4 will bring. As carers, you should all be very proud of the effort they have put into English this term.

Science, Math Assessment Mr Harbecke

At this time of the term I would like to take this opportunity to ask everyone to support our students as they work through a busy time. (Assessment time!) Over the next couple of weeks the Yr. 7, 9 and 10 Science classes will be work-

ing through assignments. While class time may be enough, we may require some time outside to complete their tasks.





The 9 and 10 Maths students will be undertaking exams and will need to set aside some time to study. They need to refresh their knowledge of the subject matter during the days and nights leading up to sitting it the exam.

We have a bright, capable bunch of students here at E.S.S. and I wish them all the best for their upcoming assessments in all subject areas.
